Next step is to identify the actual plots and summarize them: either the agency does this or the liasons do this. Once existing info is identified, determine which questions need further data.

NASA Heliophysics - Todd Hoeksema

Nothing on wiki yet, but Todd has the following to relate: I had a talk with Arik Posner (our Heliophysics contact at NASA HQ) over lunch on Monday at the AGU meeting and we have a plan to identify which questions are important and answerable. Given our hectic schedule of the last several weeks, this was real progress and should wind up with some closure in early January.

NASA Planetary - Jim Buckley

Policies and Proposal Structure filled in. No summary of existing data or questions to be asked, but Resources has been populated with information from which existing stats could be found and summarized.

NSF Astronomy - James Lowenthal

Policies and Proposal Structure filled in. Summary of existing stats are done, using a populated Resources link. Questions have been pared down to those that seem doable. Needs agency interaction to further winnow or produce.

NSF Particle Astrophysics - Angela Olinto

No Policies and Proposal information. Resources is populated, but there is no summary of the resources listed on the wiki. What IS there is a nice set of questions related to the "drill down" and answers from Jim Whitmore on what is hard and what is easy. I have cleaned up the wiki format, so it is now readable. The part on impact to researchers cannot come from the agency, but could provide the backbone for our survey questions to AAS and AIP. The next step is to answer the questions for which we already have data under resources, leaving it obvious which still open.

DOE Cosmic Frontier - Prisca Cushman

Policies and Proposal Information is there in lots of detail. Questions from the original brainstorming are there and have been pared down to only those that can be answered by DOE, but not properly prioritized.
